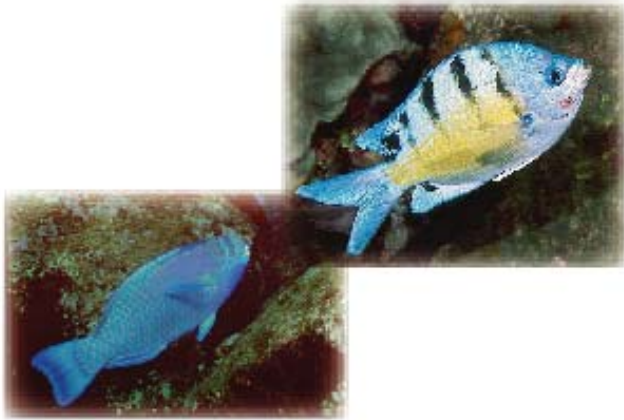


## E MĀLAMA HANAUMA



### PROTECT & PRESERVE

For the health & safety of all creatures of the Bay, the following are PROHIBITED in the park:

- Taking or altering of any coral, sand, shell or rock
- Taking or injuring of marine life
- Walking, standing, or sitting on the reef
- Feeding the fish or birds

One out of every four species of fish in the Bay is endemic—native and unique to Hawai'i! This makes Hanauma a very special place.

The Bay is home to many marine animals including the threatened green sea turtle, or honu. Honu are protected by the Federal Endangered Species Act, as well as state laws. It is illegal to harass, chase, touch or feed honu. Enjoy viewing honu at a distance.



Founded in 1990, the Hanauma Bay Education Program (HBEP) is a non-profit, volunteer-based organization whose mission is to enhance appreciation and promote understanding and stewardship of Hanauma Bay and Hawaii's marine environment through public education.

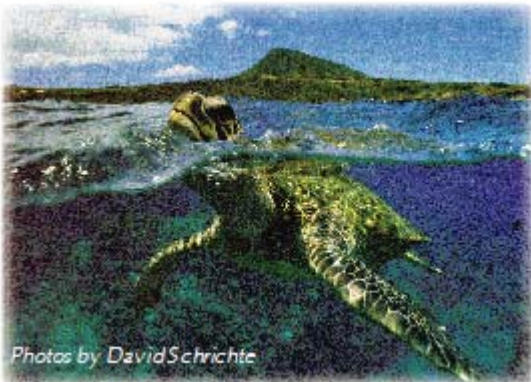


## Schools & Education Groups

### Education Group Visits:

Hanauma Bay is unlike other beach parks in Hawai'i. Hanauma is a Nature Preserve and Marine Life Conservation District. To ensure protection of this special place, a City ordinance requires all groups (community, church, sports, school etc.) wishing to enter the park to obtain a permit.\*

Permits allow a two hour visitation at the Bay, including a required 30-45 minute orientation.\*



### Educational orientation provided:

All visitors to the Nature Preserve are required to view a 9-minute educational video before accessing the beach. Your group will enjoy a private showing as part of your orientation.

Educational visits can be tailored to the learning goals of the class, including standards-based programs.

Examples of topics that can be addressed in your orientation:

- Reef ecology
- Geology
- Cultural history
- Conservation
- Marine life identification
- Marine protected areas

A limited number of permits are available each day. Education permits are only issued to non-commercial groups.\*

### Be prepared to provide:

Name of group & contact person

Phone, fax, e-mail, and mailing address

Number of individuals in group

(maximum of 45 individuals per permit)

Age or grade level of group (if school group)

Date of requested visit

Time of requested visit (9:00 am, 11:00 am, 1:00 pm or 3:00 pm)

Permits are issued from the Preserve Office. The Education Program will forward your permit request to the Preserve Office and a permit application is prepared and faxed to you. Sign and fax the application back to the Preserve Office. If approved, the permit is signed by the Preserve Manager and faxed back to you. Please bring this signed copy of the approved permit when you visit.

\*Note: Commercial groups and activities are regulated by the City. Please contact the Hanauma Bay Preserve Office at (808) 396-4229 for more information about obtaining a commercial permit.

## Hanauma Bay Nature Preserve



### Park hours:

**October to March** 6:00 am - 6:00 pm\*

**April to September** 6:00 am - 7:00 pm\*

\*Closed all day Tuesdays

### Fees:

\$7.50 entrance fee for all non-residents, 13 years and older (admission waived for Hawaii residents with proper ID). Cash and credit cards only.

Personal vehicles (cars, vans) may park in the public parking lot for \$1.00 charge

Buses may drop-off and pick-up groups with permits in the bus-loading zone only. Buses may not park at the Bay.
